## Location map and details of the observation



Name of the site: "La Regancha" (Bujaraloz)

Age/sex: Male in its 1st year (Euring code: 3). \*\*Notice: the 3 inner postjuvenile great coberts and the most likely new/postjuvenile outer tert contrasting with the rest of the juvenile-feathered wing (more brownish and worn-1<sup>st</sup> picture).

## Status in Spain. Number of sightings

Vagrant, likely to be registered and accepted by the Spanish Bird Rarities Comitee (SEO-CR)

28 records until 2016 from up to 43 different birds according to the SEO-CR. 4 new sightings in 2017 (<u>www.reservoirbirds.com</u> and <u>www.rarebirdspain.net</u>). So this is the 33th record for this species in Spain.

This is the second time this species has been spotted in Aragon. Last time was January 2012 near "Salada de la Playa", only 4 kilometres south from this second sighting!
